
Coalition of 10 faiths mobilizing communities nationwide to end maternal, infant, and child malaria mortality in Mozambique



TAM Goals

- (1) Increase access to information about malaria prevention and treatment.
- (2) Increase capacity for faith leaders to lead malaria prevention activities.
- (3) Strengthen faith community coordination with public and private partners.



TAM's 5 Key Messages

- Cooperate with house-spraying campaigns as these protect you from malaria.
- All must sleep under a mosquito net, especially pregnant women and children ages 0-5.
- When feeling feverish, go immediately to the hospital.
- While pregnant, all women must receive preventive treatment against malaria at least twice.
- Complete the treatment given to you.









2008-2010 Results
